Adrian Brown is a NJ resident that joined the Navy in 2008. Adrian has served on the USS Gunston Hall, as a Logistician at Fisc Norfolk, was part of the F18 squadron VFA 32 on Oceana and on the USS Harry S. Truman where he was deployed to Afghanistan. While deployed in Afghanistan, Adrian was injured where he sustained a traumatic brain injury. Adrian receives frequent treatments and care at one of the specialized rehabilitation facilities through his local VA Medical Center. Adrian has since retired from the Navy due to his injuries and currently works as a Logistician for the Naval Surface Warfare Center (NSWC) Indian Head Division Picatinny Detachment. Adrian holds a BA in Logistics Management, an MBA and is currently pursuing his Doctorate in Philosophy (PhD). Adrian has two children, Nigel (13) and Adrianna (9), an OIF/OEF Disabled Veteran, and has been honored for his Service by the NY METS as a Wounded Warrior. Adrian has been honored with several Armed Forces Medals.



Aaron Alonzo, a US Marine with the 1st battalion, 9th Marines out of Camp Lejeune, was deployed to Afghanistan one week after his wife Jessica gave birth to their daughter Riley. Aaron was seriously injured on an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) while on patrol. The blast resulted in Aaron losing both legs. Aaron has made amazing strides in his recovery, maintains a positive attitude, and works hard with his physical therapy; continued support with his long-term care is needed for future surgeries. Among Aaron's accomplishment are climbing the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, DC and skiing in Vail, Colorado, with the assistance of the Vail Veterans Program.



Brad Lattig, a resident of Pottersville, NJ, joined active duty Army in 1996. Brad attended basic training at Fort Sill, OK, where he trained as a Bradley Fighting Vehicle Mechanic at Fort Knox, KY, and was later assigned to 3rd BN 7th Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, GA. Brad was deployed to Kuwait in Feb 1998 as part of 1st Brigade Task Force for Operation Desert Thunder Desert Fox where he sustained multiple injuries in the line of duty. Upon returning home, Brad was treated for his injuries and Honorably discharged in 1999. Brad has since retired from the Army and currently works in the US Army ARDEC Mortars Division at Picatinny Arsenal, NJ. Brad has been honored with the Bronze Star Medal, and a host of other awards.
